Facts

- Since 1994
- All Danish universities (8) are members of DUN
- 1200 individual members
- 9-person board representing educational developers from all universities, elected bi-annually
- Secretariat with a staff (1½ academic + secretarial staff)
- DUN is sponsored by member universities (ca. 60.000 Euro per year in institutional membership fees)

Running activities

- Annual national conference on university teaching and learning (ca. 170 delegates) + ad hoc courses and events
- Bi-annual peer reviewed journal *Danish Journal of Teaching and Learning in Higher Education*
- Web page with resources etc.

New activities 2014-2015

- Establishing a permanent secretariat to support activities

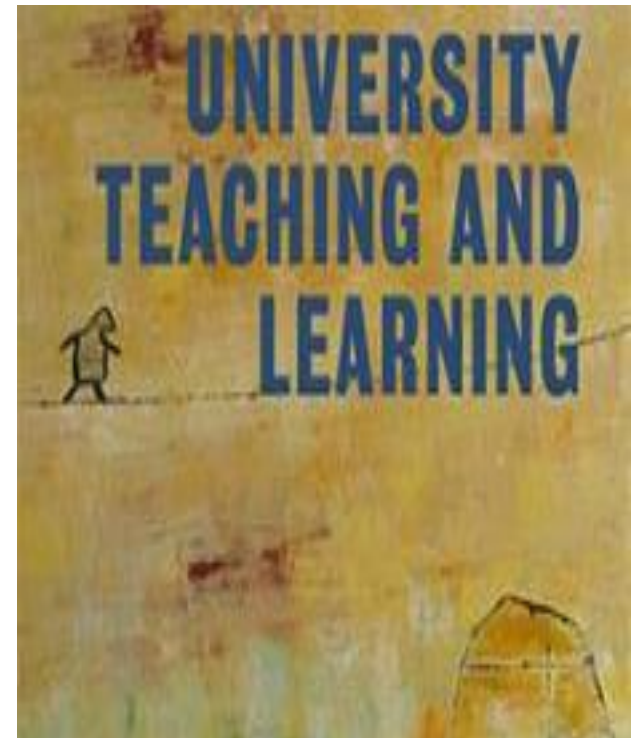
