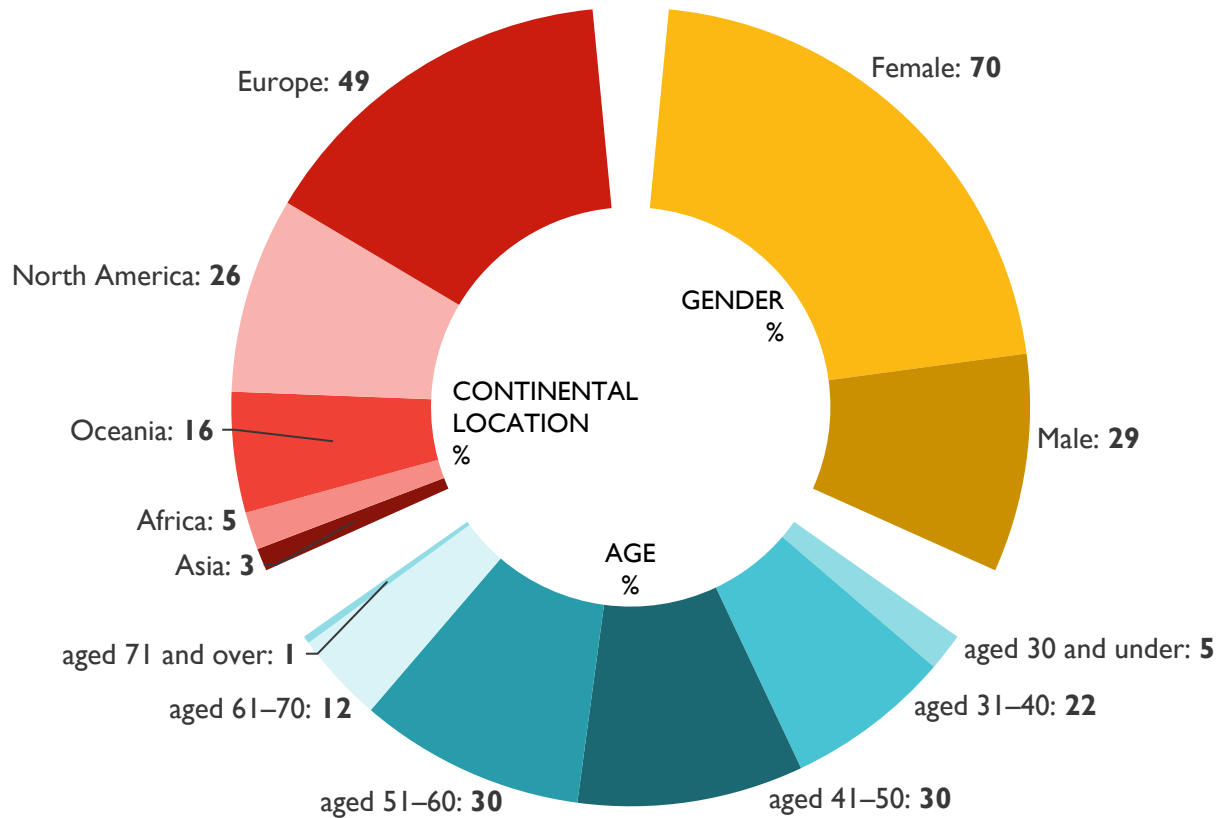

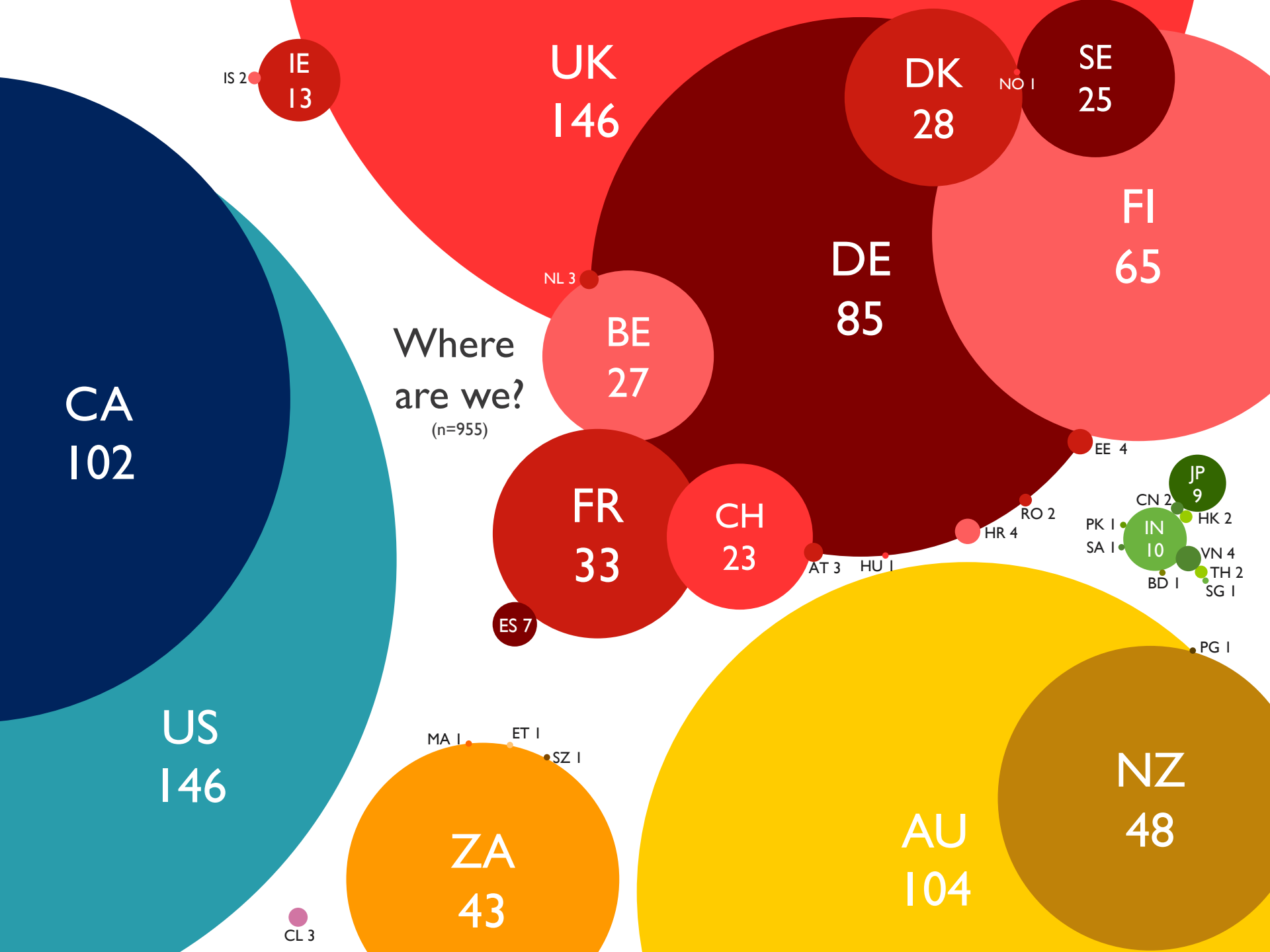

# Who are we?

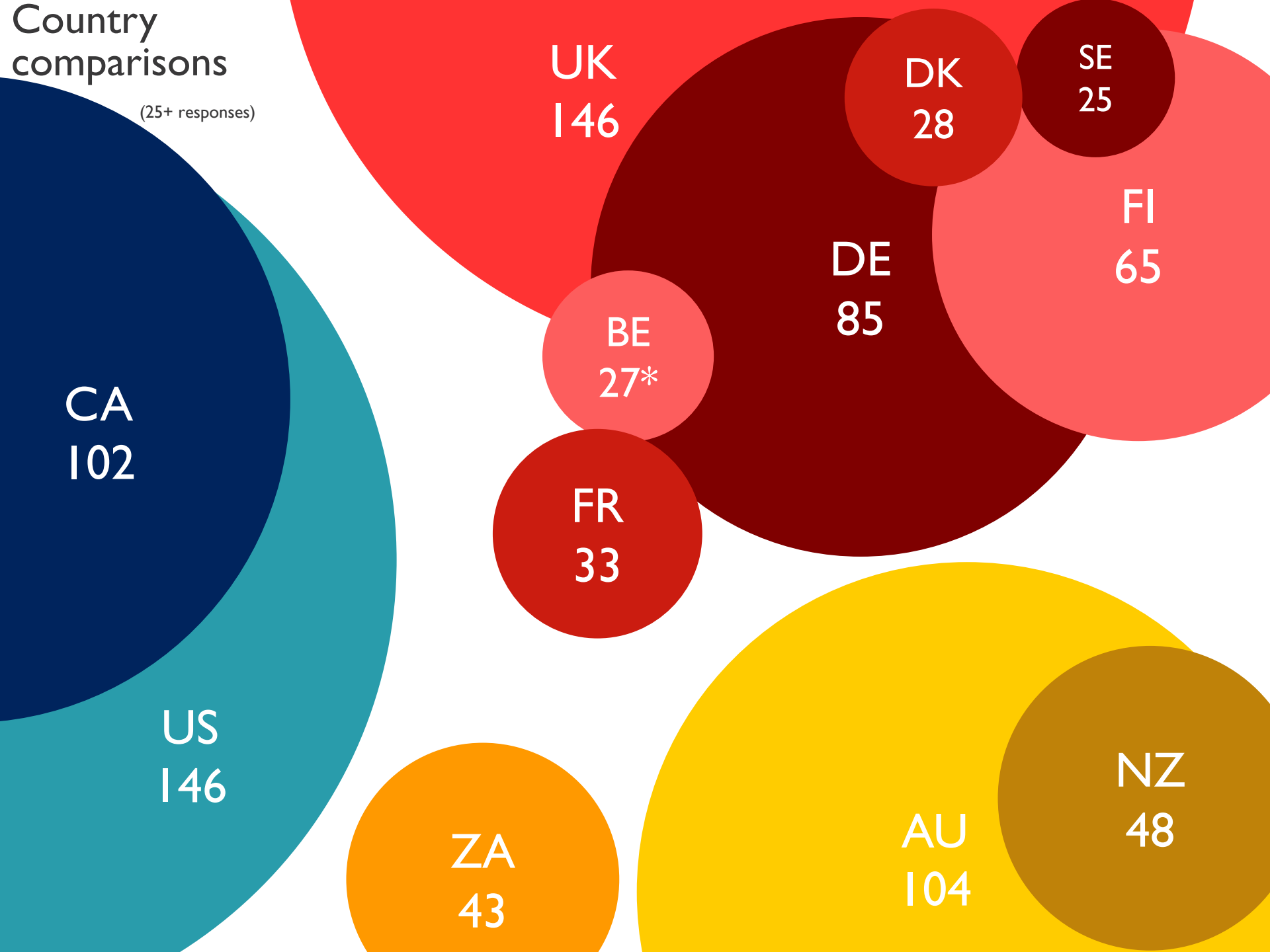
Gender, age, and continental location (nearest %; n= 959, 959, and 956 respectively)

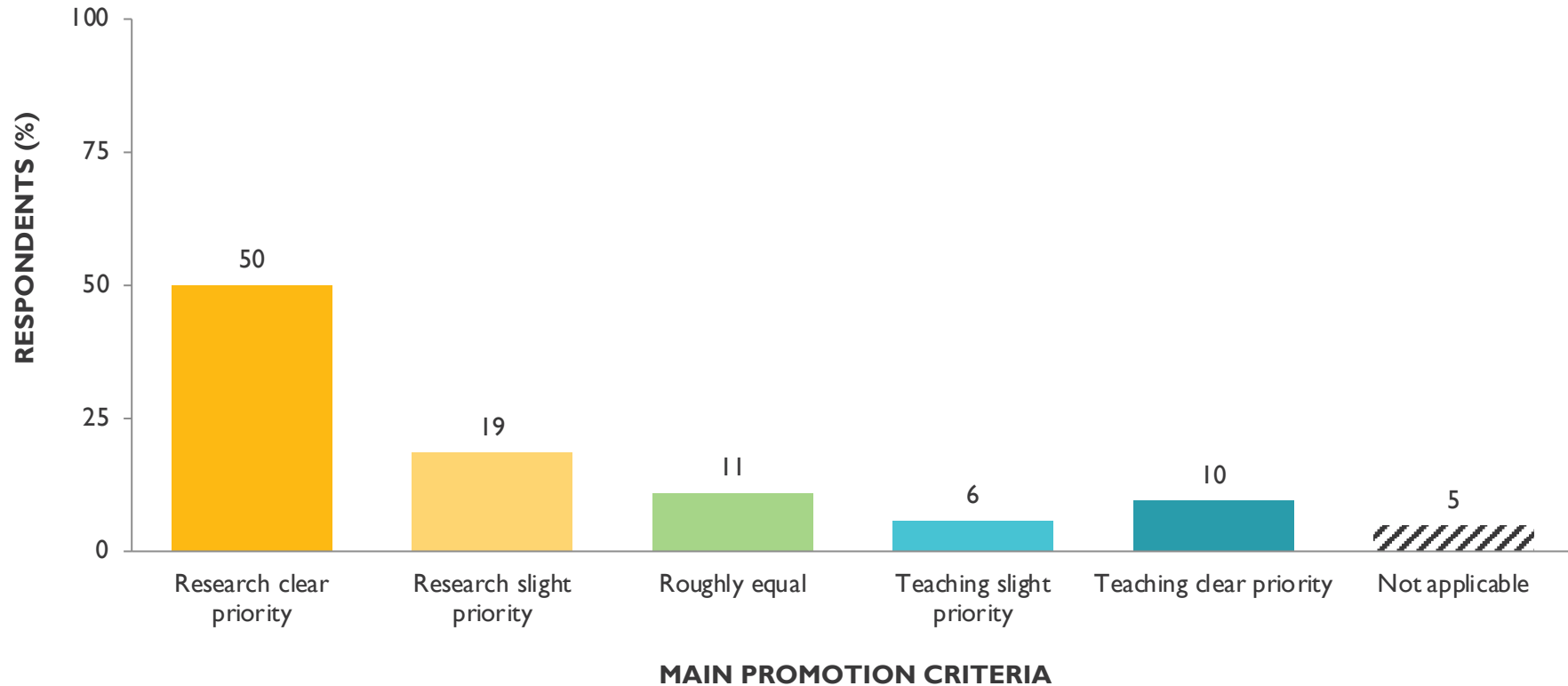

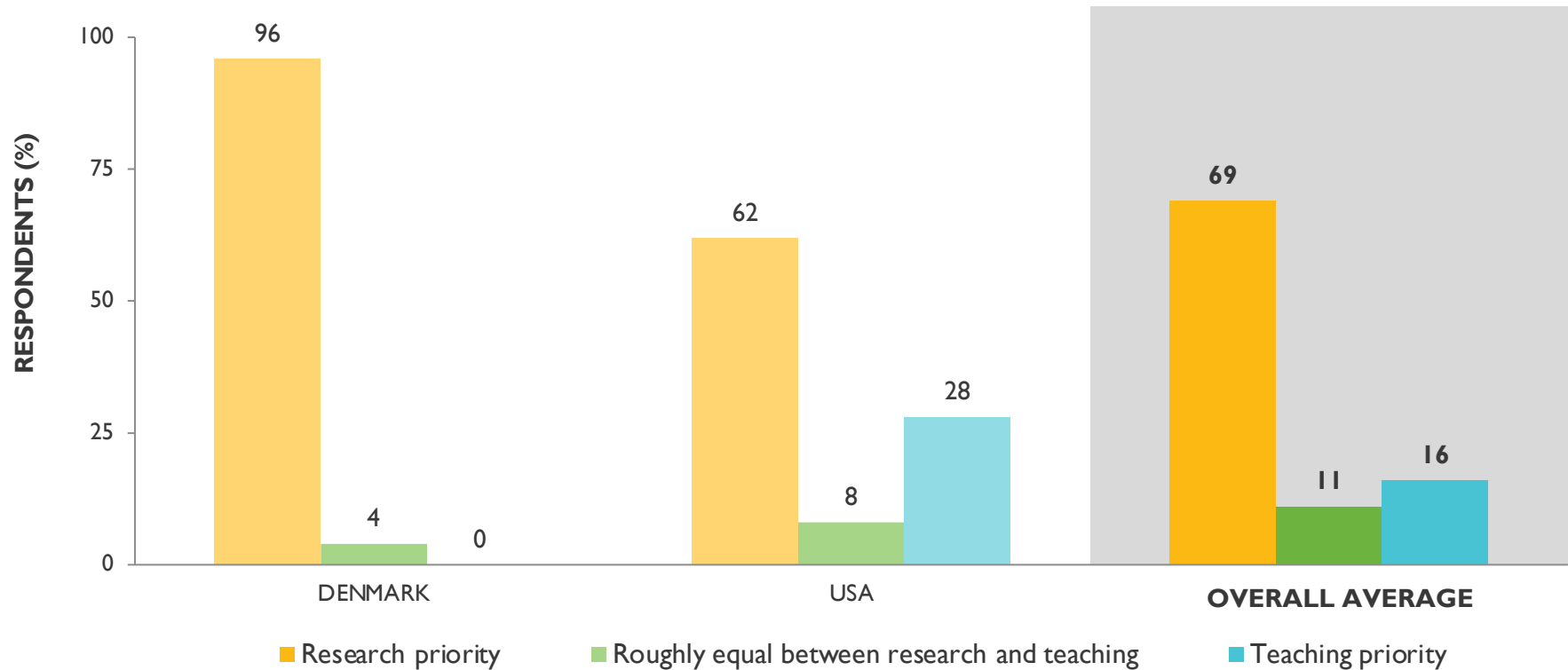
# What is most valued at our institutions?

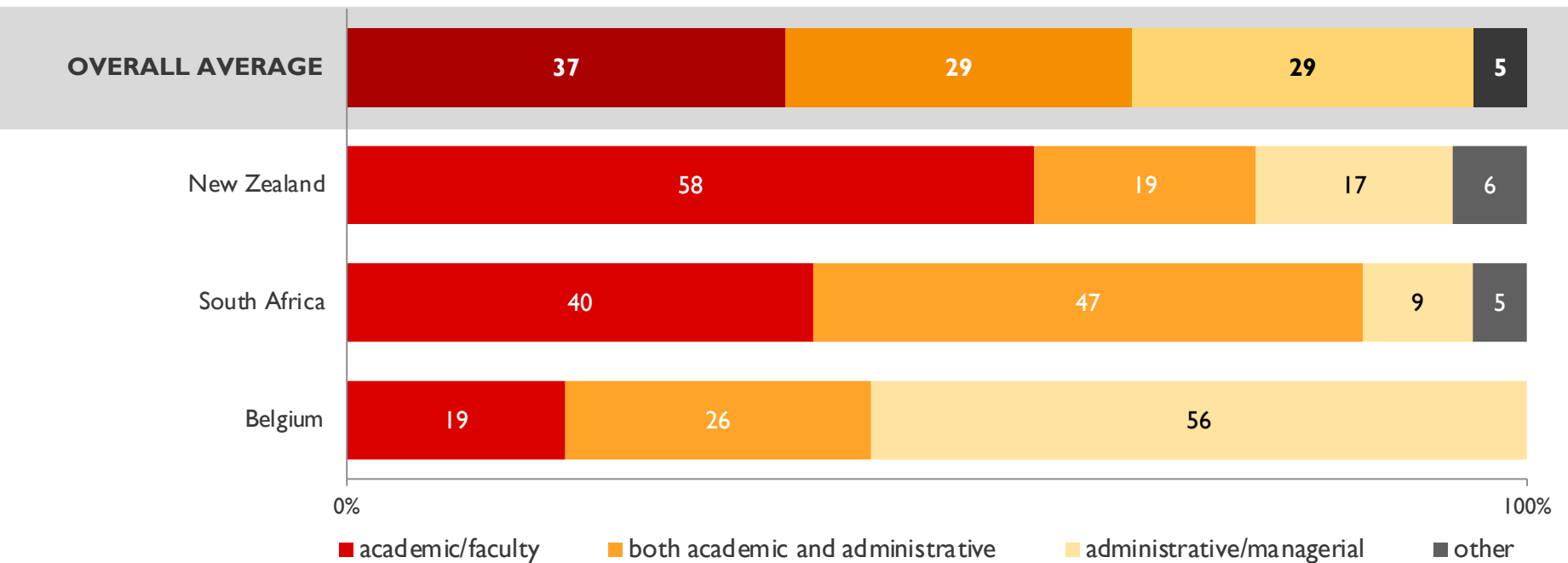
Main promotion criteria: Overall average (n=1,101) and country variability (nearest %)

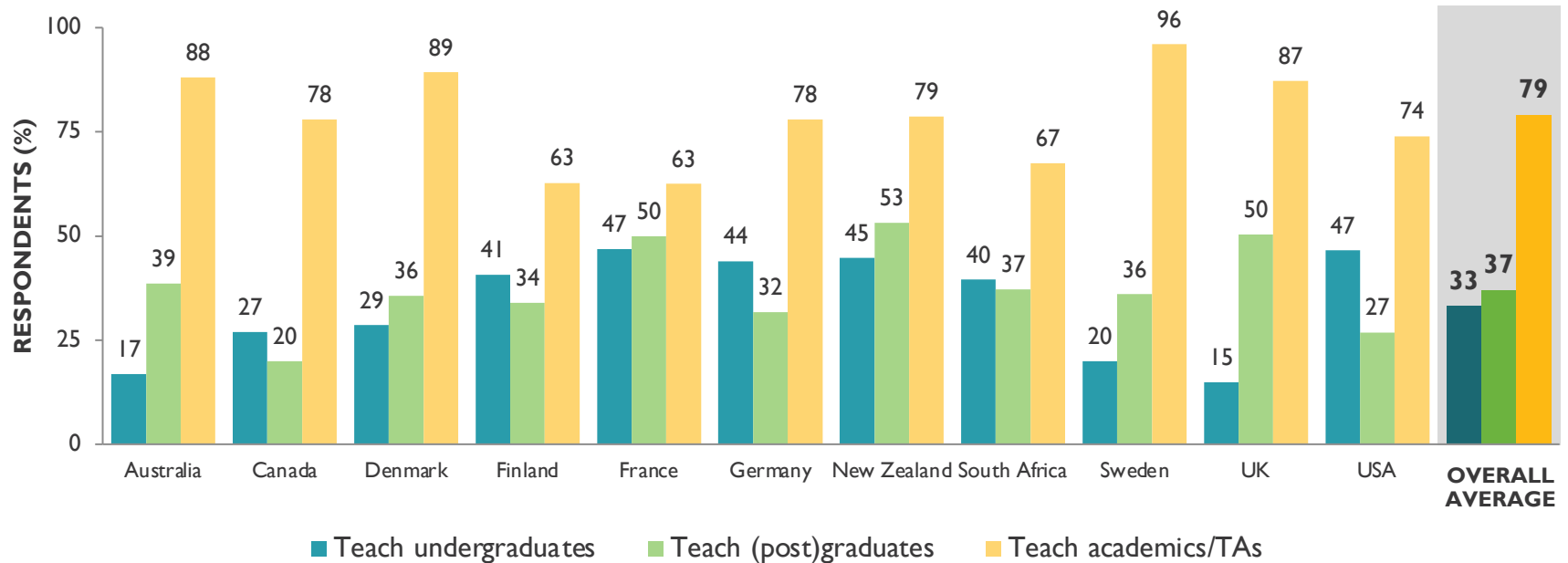
# What are our contractual roles?

Overall average (n=974) and country variability (nearest percentage point)



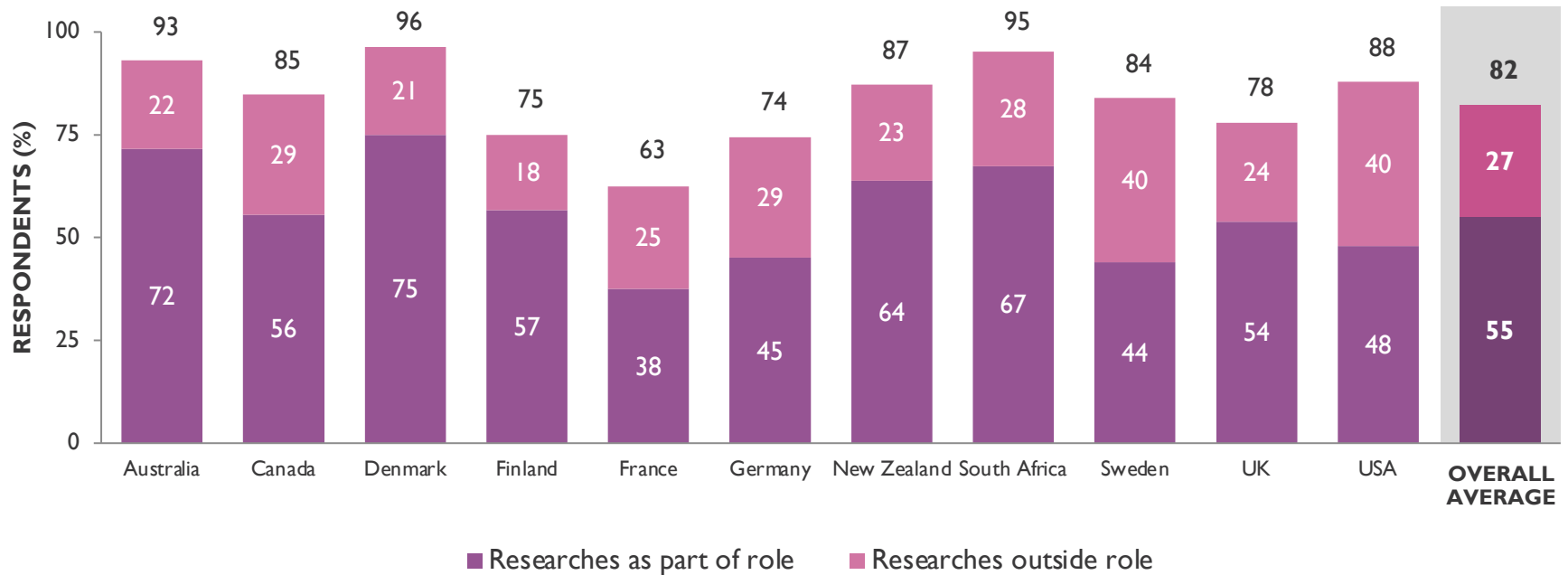
# Who do we teach as part of our jobs?

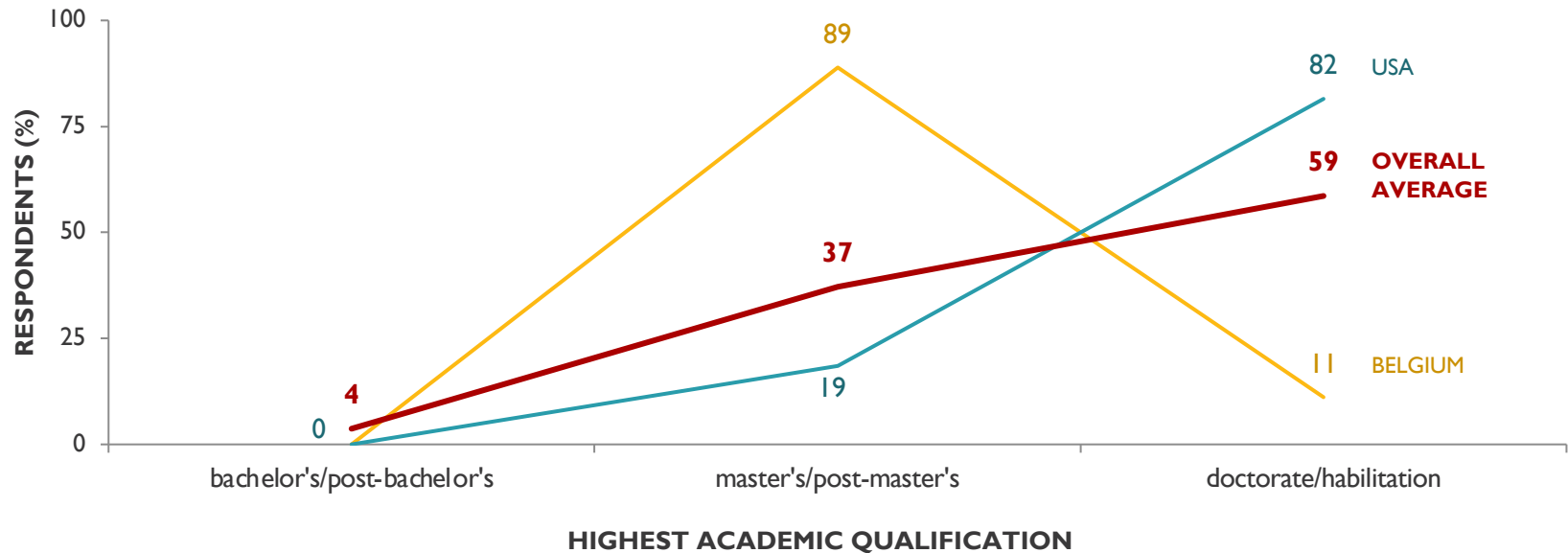

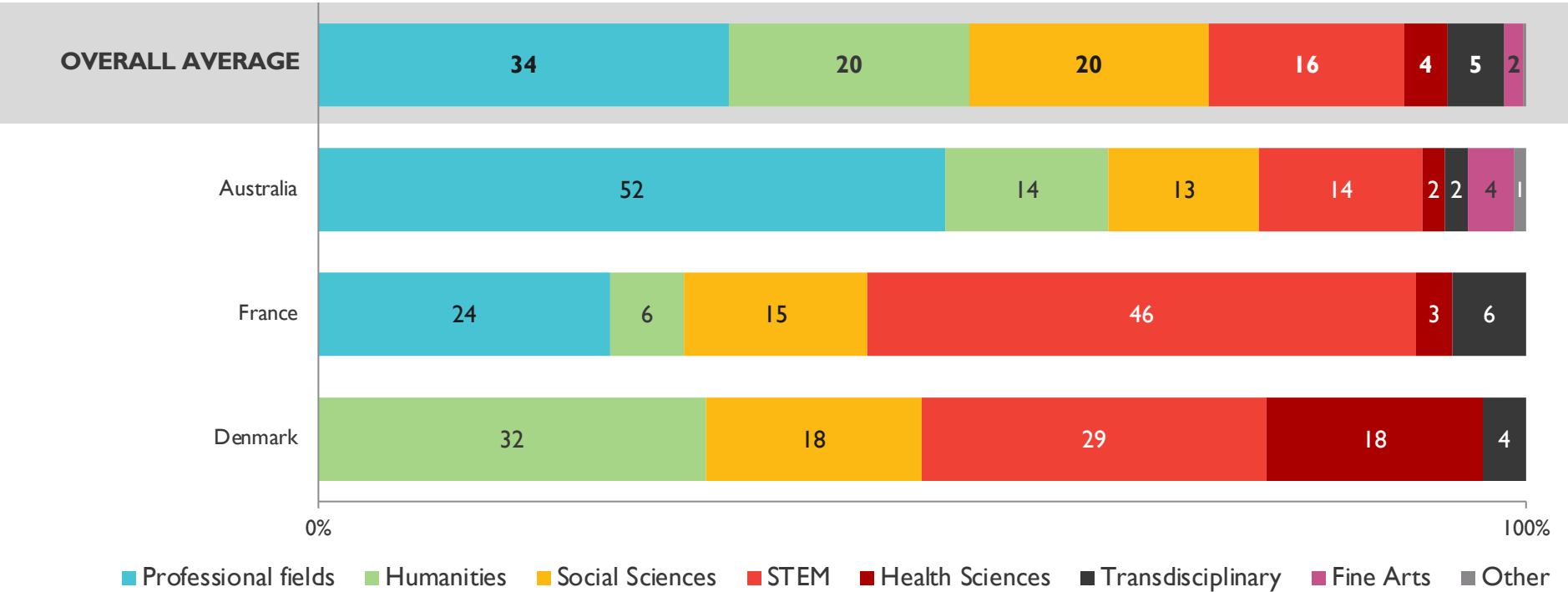
Overall average (n=1,045) and country variability (nearest percentage point)

Broad field of highest degree: Overall average (n=1,039) and country variability (nearest %)

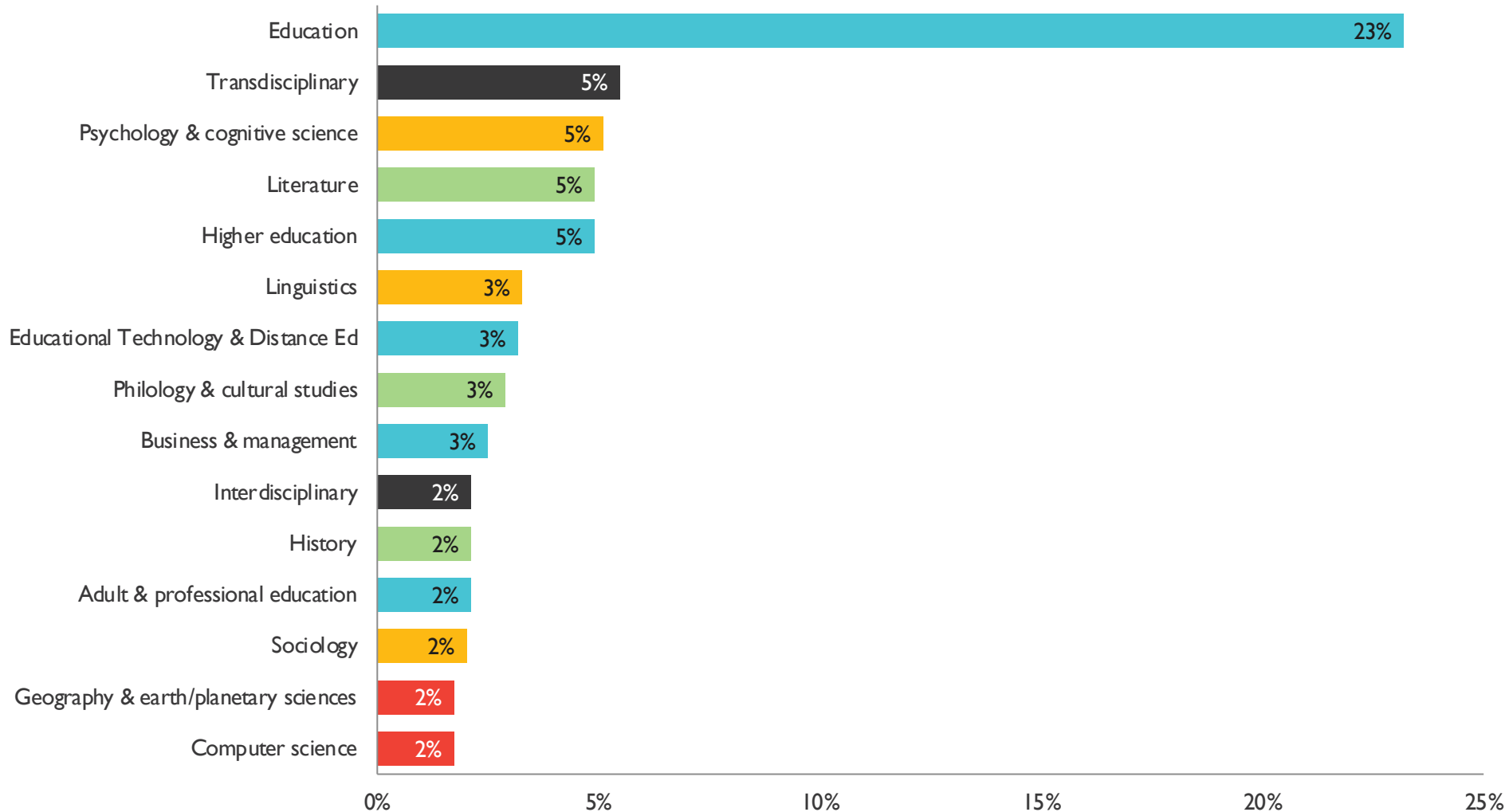
